Sir

I beg to mention to you the names of William Little, Elizabeth Clarkson, and Ann Fenn, whom I tried at the late York Assizes and of William Barker who was tried by Mr Justice Casewell at the same Assizes. These prisoners were convicted of Highway Robbery and another with violence or in the company with others. The Clause of the Statute of Q. Victoria obliged me to sentence them respectively to 15 years transportation. We are desires however of limiting the term in each case to 10 years, thinking that will best meet the justice of the case under the circumstances.
