

Ann Lovell pre Hindostan 1839 - ID 6320

To the Right Honourable Lord John Russell Secretary of State for the Home Department

The humble Petition of ROBERT LOVELL - Labourer of the Parish of Milverton (and late of the Parish of Chipstable) in the county of Somerset.

Humbly Sheweth

That the wife of your Petitioner ANN LOVELL was at the last General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Somerset held at Taunton in the said county , convicted of stealing from a field a certain basket containing a knife and fork, a dish and a plate, together with a jar containing a small quantity of cider, the property of Mr John Featherstone that for this offence the said ANN LOVELL was sentenced to be transported for the term of seven years.

Your Petitioner is nearly 50 years of age and a very ill state of health he therefore most humbly prays your Lordship to take the case of his wife into consideration with the hope, that your Lordship may be enable to make such a recommendation to Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen as shall induce Her Majesty to grant some commutation of her sentence as Her Majesty as in mercy may see fit.

And your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray.
