Honored Sir

I humbly beg leave to lay before you that ANN SCOFFIELD was tried at the Old Bailey this present session for stealing and pledging a silk handkerchief the property of John Sullivan of No 10 Maynard Street, Saint Giles in the Fields - who was tried in the name of ANN SCOFIELD by mistake, and sentenced to 7 years transportation. I beg further to state that the prisoner had lived in my house the last eight months and I always found her an honest sober and virtuous character, Previous to this unfortunate - the Prosecutor not having a desire that the rigour of the law should not rest upon her, your petitioner humbly solicits your kind interference in her behalf not to be sent from her mother land.
