Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioner had in the employ of the Prosecutor as Shop woman and during the time she was with [her] she purchased a shawl and other articles, but having caused her [] though being the means of her being [] in borrowing some money, and in her [] she brought a charge of felony against your humble Petitioner and having no witnesses to prove

that she bought them, she received the severe sentence of seven years transportation and being her first conviction she humbly begs that she may receive a mitigation of her sentence.
