Jane Wing aged 16

Sussex Quarter Sessions – Lewes September 1848, Stealing from the person, 10 years transportation, Gaol Report – Character Very bad. Convicted and twice in prison before.

Series – HO 18, Piece Number – 261

Put her away

The Chairman of the Quarter Sessions states that he had inquired into the case and that he sees no reason for recommending an investigation or mitigation of the sentence. The Chairman has not been referred to and his object in making this communication is not explained.

16th October 1848

Sir

I have the honour of informing you that JANE WING aged 16 was tried and found guilty at the Lewes intermediate Sessions on the 23rd September last, in the Court over which I presided of stealing at Brighton a purse containing a small sum of money from the person of Caroline Anderson and as she had been previously convicted of a felony and bearing a very bad character was sentenced to be transported for ten years.

I have since made further inquiries into the character of JANE WING and found her to be a common prostitute at Brighton , I see no

reason for suggesting any investigation into her character and sentence.
