The Humble Memorial of **Mary Mooney** a Prisoner confined in Naas Gaol.

Most Humbly Sheweth

That your Excellency's Memst is confined in Naas Gaol since the 30th October 1844 and Tried at last assizes 25th March 1844 under the Vagrant Act and the sentence of the Hon. Court was that your Excellency's Memst was put under Rule of Bail herself in £5 and two sureties of £2-10^seach within Six Months if not to be Transported for Seven Years.

Your Excellency's Memst humbly Prays that you will be Graciously pleased to take Memst into your kind consideration and have an order made that your Excellency's Memst shall be sent off with the next Female Convicts as your Memst never could get Bail.
